Brave Spirits Theatre is proud to announce its fourth production, William Shakespeare's *Romeo* and *Juliet*.

O God, I have an ill-divining soul!

Driven by both passion and pragmatism, Juliet embarks upon her journey from adolescence through womanhood to death in the span of only four summer days. Tempers are short, emotions are extreme, and time melts like an ice cube in the heat.

Performed in Brave Spirits' fast-paced, ensemble-driven style, Shakespeare's classic tale of young love takes on added urgency. Victoria Reinsel and Charlene V. Smith previously teamed up to explore Juliet's story in a one-woman play, *What, Lamb! What, Ladybird!*, which had its world premiere at the 2011 Capital Fringe Festival. *What, Lamb! What, Ladybird!*, performed by Charlene V. Smith and directed by Victoria Reinsel, received five stars from *MD Theatre Guide* and was hailed as "dynamic" with "abundant wit and charm."

Romeo and Juliet will perform Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights at 8pm, and Saturday matinees at 2pm, from June 12 – June 22. Press night is Wednesday, June 12th at 8pm. There will be a pay-what-you-will preview performance on Tuesday, June 11th at 8pm. The performances will take place at the Atlas Performing Arts Center in their Lab Theatre II, located at 1333 H Street, NE, Washington, DC 20002 (www.atlasarts.org). Tickets are \$15 for adults and \$10 for students and seniors. Tickets are on sale through the Atlas PAC website.

The cast is made up of actors from across the DC region with extensive experience in Shakespeare and early modern drama. They have worked with the American Shakespeare Center, the Shakespeare Theatre Company, Folger Theatre, Theater at Monmouth, Taffety Punk Theatre Company, Virginia Shakespeare Festival, Orlando Shakespeare Theater, and Chesapeake Shakespeare Company, among others. About Brave Spirits Theatre

Brave Spirits Theatre, founded in 2011 by Victoria Reinsel and Charlene V. Smith, is a professional theatre company dedicated to bringing fresh, energetic productions of the works of William Shakespeare and other early modern playwrights to the Washington, D.C. region. We have a triangular focus: text, actor, and audience.

Text: We are unabashedly obsessed with language. We believe the text itself holds all the clues we need to perform an early modern play with truth and vitality. We examine imagery, verse, rhetorical devices, and embedded stage directions. Shakespeare and his contemporaries wrote beautiful poetry, but they also wrote bawdy, gritty, realistic prose and we embrace both with equal relish. In short, we trust the text and it is the basis of our work.

Actor: We are a company that believes the actor is at the center of the artistic process. We seek out artists who are willing to take creative risks, who are bold and courageous, who are ensemble-driven, and who are professionally-minded in their commitment to the art. The actor is the vessel through which the text comes to life, and as such the actor must be willing to bare his or her soul onstage, and must be intellectually, emotionally, physically, and spiritually adept.

Audience: We feel that the audience is the final ingredient needed to bring the play to life. In keeping with the early modern aesthetic, there is no fourth wall, and we engage the audience as a fellow actor, an active participant in the world of the play. Actors may turn the audience into a raucous mob, their confidants, or the butt of a joke. By playing with the audience rather than to them, we make these plays exciting, accessible, and relevant.

Brave Spirits Theatre debuted in the summer of 2011 with Shakespeare's early comedy *The Two Gentlemen of Verona*. Performed with just six actors, the production was lively and fresh, exploring the play's comedy, romance, and pathos. Maryland Shakespeare praised the production as performed with "imagination, and passion, and a love for the spoken word." Last summer, Brave Spirits applied their ensemble-driven, bare-bones style to Shakespeare's mammoth history play, *Richard III*. DC Theatre Scene noted that the production's "clever ferris wheel of props and toys spotlights a host of minor characters with a lot of personality" and Eric Minton of Shakespeareances.com hailed the performances as a place "where you can discover clarity of vision and superb talent flourishing under the mainstream radar."
